Poetry —language play that often contains figurative language and rhyme																					
Biography/Autobiography —the true story about someone's life experiences																					
Historical Fiction —facts from history are woven into a fictional story																					
Science Fiction —facts from science are woven into a fictional story																					
Modern Fiction —modern setting, problems, and characters interact in a fictional story																					
Mystery and Detective Stories —Clues lead to a solution or clarification of a problem/crime																					
Fantasy —fiction in which characters and/or setting is wildly imaginative, impossible, or fairy tale-like																					
Picture Book —a book that has many pictures that help tell the story or illustrate ideas.
